Computer Ethics Institute Updated Ten Commandm

WASHINGTON — Based on the motto, "All information systems have one weak link: People," the newly formed Computer Ethics Institute in Washington has issued a ten-plate update of the original Mount Sinai in the early days of public relations.
The Ten Command

- Thou shalt not use a computer to steal.
- Thou shalt not use a computer to bear false witness.
- Thou shalt not copy or use proprietary software for which you have not paid.
- Thou shalt not use other people's computer resources without authorization or proper files.
- Thou shalt not interfere with others people's computer work.
- Though shalt not interfere with others people's computer work.
- Thou shalt not snoop around in other people's computers.
- Thou shalt not use a computer to create false files.
- Thou shalt not use a computer to bear false witness.
- Thou shalt not copy or use proprietary software for which you have not paid.
- Thou shalt not use other people's computer resources without authorization or proper files.
